FLIRTY CHATBOTS

Bernie.ai, a chatbot with deep-learning AI and facial recognition that could sift through *Tinder* matches and strike up introductory text chats, launched in 2016.

The bot could learn your preferences **and talk like you**, but it was short-lived.

Tinder banned it in 2017, after it had performed about 9 million actions, such as swiping, and made around 100,000 matches.

The prediction is that more bots like this will operate in the future.
